

40 And when he was come near, he beheld the city, and wept over it;

41 Saying, If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! But now they are hid from thine eyes.

42 For the days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side;


43 And shall lay thee even with the ground, and thy children within thee, and they shall not leave in thee, one stone upon another; because thou knewest not the time of thy visitation (Luke 19).










- ▶ Jesus was coming at Passover time
 - ▶ There would have been hundreds of people on the road
 - ▶ Luke 19:27 Jesus ... went before, ascending up to Jerusalem
 - ▶ Coming out of Jericho, lowest city in the world
 - ▶ 846 feet below sea level (258 meters)
 - ▶ Jerusalem is on a mountain
 - ▶ 2,490 feet above sea level (760 meters)

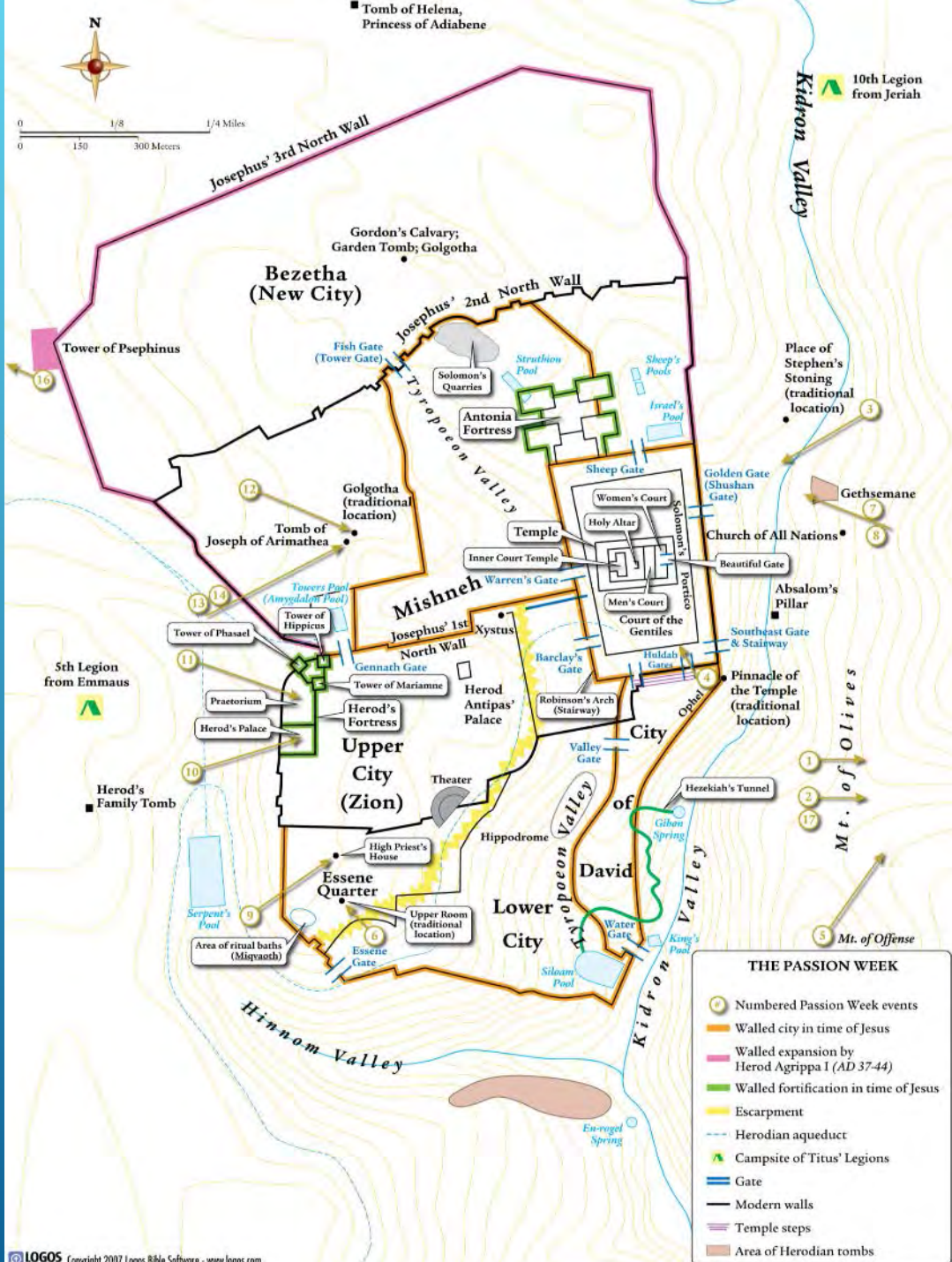




- ▶ Psalms 120-134 are called the Psalms of Degrees in our Bible
 - ▶ Psalms of Ascent
 - ▶ Read or recited by pilgrims to Jerusalem to prepare them to worship at the Temple (in the presence of God).
 - ▶ Luke 13:23-30
 - ▶ Remember the question of Psalm 15: Who shall abide in thy tabernacle? Who shall dwell in they holy hill of Zion?

- ▶ 120 From a far distance
- ▶ 121 Lift up mine eyes unto the hills from whence help comes
- ▶ 122 I was glad when they said, Let us go to the house of God
- ▶ 123 Unto thee will I lift up mine eyes
- ▶ 124 If the Lord had not been on our side
- ▶ 125 Trust in the Lord on Mt Zion can't be removed, abide
- ▶ 126 When the Lord turned again the captivity of Zion
- ▶ 127 Except the Lord build the house, it is built in vain
 - ▶ Families

- ▶ 128 Blessed is everyone who fears the Lord ...
- ▶ 129 Many afflictions of faithful: The Lord is righteous: he hath cut asunder the cords of the wicked
- ▶ 130 If thou, Lord shouldst mark iniquities who shall stand?
- ▶ 131 Lord, my heart is not haughty ... I have behaved and quieted myself as a child
- ▶ 132 Lord, remember David ... For the Lord has chosen Zion
- ▶ 133 How good and pleasant for brethren to dwell in unity
- ▶ 134 Bless ye the Lord ... that made heaven and earth bless thee out of Zion
